- reflect the role of mobility in pastoralism

This Film Festival seeks to deepen understanding of how diverse peoples across the world gain their livelihoods from extensive livestock husbandry. The relationships of pastoralists, their animals and their food production systems reflect an intimate intertwining of culture, economy and ecology in highly variable environments such as drylands and mountainous areas.

The festival, organised by members of the Coalition of European Lobbies for Eastern African Pastoralism (CELEP), showcases films meant to spark dialogue and inspire debate.
